Arizona Anti Trafficking Network

\$19,371

Supports activities to stop trafficking in Arizona.

Adopt a Native Elder

\$5,000

Serves elders of the Navajo Nation who are unable to provide for basic necessities.

Arizona Dental Foundation

\$5,000

The Give Kids a Smile dental program helps underserved children ages 6-12 with no means to obtain dental care.

Arizona StRUT

\$3,500

To support Techie Camps, which teach technology skills to Title 1 middle school students throughout the Valley.

Arizonans for Children

\$2,500
